OPERATION VALKYRIE @ 75: THE PLOT TO ASSASSINATE HITLER

Join Dr. Hylander on Monday, August 19 at 2 p.m. as we examine the details of the plot to assassinate Hitler. By 1944, with the Allied landings in France and the collapse of the Eastern Front, conspirators within the German Officer Corps planned a coup to eliminate Hitler and to open negotiations with the West to end the war. After careful planning, Col. Claus von Stauffenberg volunteered to place a bomb in Hitler's conference room timed to explode during his daily military briefing. Pre-registration is required for this event.
