





2023 Annual Town Meeting

- The Town Administrator and Financial Team have been working diligently over the last several months to prepare a balanced FY24 budget to present at the 2023 Annual Town Meeting
- The Warrant Report is available on the 2023 Annual Town Meeting page of the Town's website and will be mailed to every household in late April
- Annual Town Meeting is May 1 in the Amos Clark Kingsbury Gymnasium at 7PM. All registered voters are encouraged to participate

Town Clerk

- The Annual Town Election was on March 27th, 2023. Election results and statistics are on the Town Clerk's page of the Town's website
- The Annual Town Election made official the name change from Board of Selectmen to the Select Board first approved by the 2022 Annual Town Meeting
- Dog licenses were due by April 1st. A late fee of \$25 will now be applied



Financial Team

- The Fiscal Year 2022 audit has been completed on time
- Real estate taxes are due May 1

Land Use Department

- Open Space & Recreation Plan Update – The draft plan is posted to the Town's website and in April/May, members of the OSRP Committee will be presenting the plan for approval by the Planning Board, Parks and Recreation Commission, Conservation Commission, and Select Board prior to submitting to the State for a 7-year approval
