Business:

The Selectmen have appointed Robert Hilton to the Commission and Peter Schroeder to represent the Town and C.C. to the C.R.V.W.A. Mr. Schroeder will assume the "bottle dipping" of the river previously done by Daniel Hinkley.

Notices were read of the meeting on April 28 to hear a report of the A.C.E. on the C.R.V.W. and its relationship to Medfield -- a joint meeting of all towns involved is planned for May 13.

Mrs. Gifford, Robert Hilton, Peter Schroeder and Louise Lockhart attended the P.B. meeting and the Chairman requested a map of the lands we have already acquired, the lands belonging to the Trustees of Reservations, and our future plans for land acquisition -- this information to help with the updating of the M.P.I.C. The Board disapproves the plan for the Noon Hill, Section 2, 107 Lot Subdivision on the basis that the area is unsuitable for sewage disposal.

The Board of Health is concerned with the manner in which the filling of the Town Dump is handled and is also interested in our plans for that area, if any, with the idea in mind of making multiple use of all land without producing conflicts of interest between boards, etc.

The Sportsmen's Club has requested permission to plant wild rice, oats, etc. on Conservation Land as food for ducks. Permission was unanimously agreed upon and a letter will be mailed to them as confirmation.

Treasurer's Report: A gift received of \$10 from the Sportsmen's Club in memory of Daniel Hinkley, this to be added to the Cons. Fund.

Mr. Kinsman received a letter regarding the spraying of Elm Trees in Medfield which he will answer.

Mr. Donnelly sent word that Mr. Vaughn has notified him that Cheney Eng. will survey as much of the Baldwin Property as necessary for transfer to the Town of Medfield at no charge.

Mr. Pederzini reported that Mr. Wheelwright has been much impressed with the good work of the Boy Scouts on the Outdoor Classroom Land and that they need R.R. ties. Dr. Heiligmann will inform them they can be found on Rte. 27 at the M.S.H. crossing and behind the Walpole R.R. Station.



NOON HILL: Mr. Gilmore of the Medfield Office suggested that the C.C. make a definite offer of \$2,000 per Acre to James F. Gilmore for his land.

VOTED: To offer Mr. James Gilmore \$2,000 per acre for Lots # 726 A and # 726 B on Noon Hill.

Mr. Pederzini and Mrs. Kane will compose letters to Mr. Gimore and all land owners on Noon Hill and in addition Rte. 27 Area and Charles & Stop River Areas.

Dr. Heiligmann will contact the Bd. of Health regarding Lot # 18 on Marlyn Rd. owned by Henry Heald.

OUTDOOR CLASSROOM: Dr. Heiligmann has met with the Committee and also the Boy Scout leaders and Mr. Brais, and a clean-up was very successful. Two eagle scouts plan to construct a sign using telegraph poles placed in cement. Each Scout troop is planning to work on the area on Saturdays during the summer.

Mrs. Tuohey's 5th grade class has walked the area.

Mr. Giard has granted formal permission to give the C.C. his back piece of land abutting the O.C. Area, and Dr. Heiligmann will contact Cheney Eng. to survey.

Mrs. Sue Pratt, who is taking a course on Ecology, has suggested that Dr. Jorgensen (a science professor) would be available to do a one-shot teaching of teachers in the use of the O.C. for an honorarium. Mr. Hilton suggested that we use Dr. Barry Colt (Medfield Ecologist) and carefully consider the education process in relation to the school system before making any permanent arrangements. He will cooperate with Dr. Heiligmann in setting up this phase of the program.

Re-Cycling of Cans

Mrs. Lockhart A.M. contacted Mr. Barnes, Plant Mgr. of the Nat'l. Can Corp. of Millis and he will service a place for cans (55 gal. drums), and may be able to arrange pick-up. Proceeds will be returned to the local community through donations to selected environmental improvement organizations, selected by the Plant Manager.
